



## PE and Sport Premium Grant

2017 – 2018 Academic Year

The PE and Sport Premium is a grant given to school to enrich their curriculum and enable the children to access a wider range of sporting activities. It is also used to help develop teachers' skills so that the teaching of PE is of the highest quality possible. This means that some of the money is spent on staff training and teaching resources.

As well as this, some of the money is spent on resources to be used in the teaching of PE.

The school also uses sports companies that come into school to deliver specialist teaching and offer cross-curricular activities – some of this is also used as staff training to further develop staff knowledge and skills.

Below is a breakdown of the spending so far this year, and predictions for the amount of spending for the rest of the academic year.

Resource/expenditure	Expense	Impact
Skillswise fees	£2295	A range of clubs are available for children of all ages to experience different sports and activities. Reception clubs have been oversubscribed, Y1/2 football was full, Y3/4 have worked at dodgeball. Y5/6 clubs have not been fully subscribed, so experiences will be targeted more at younger children to help with their physical development – this will have a positive impact on PE further up the school. Clubs are also run at dinnertime to enrich play and develop healthier lifestyles.
REAL PE resources, teaching scheme and training	£2290	Staff will now deliver PE sessions aimed more at mobility, agility and skills that can be transferred and applied to a range of sports. This develops children's ability and enjoyment of sport.
Travel costs (swimming, competitions, etc.)	£1420	Children are able to attend competitions if parents/carers cannot get them there, ensuring involvement for all
Sports day bookings – Robin Park	£450	Children are given the children a sense of awe and wonder on their sports day – participating in a stadium is a great activity.
Judo Club	£252	Children now have an opportunity for children to experience a taster club, so that they can see if they would like to take up a martial art.
Medals and trophies	£162.50	Awards are given in PE sessions to instil a sense of pride and achievement.

In future, resources need to be bought for school to ensure that the REAL PE scheme can be delivered to its full potential. The school has budgeted around £6000 for this.

Further to this, there are likely to be similar fees for Skillswise for the second half of the year, as well as similar transport fees – this is approximately another £4,500 pounds.

This equates to approximately £17,500 pounds, with some redundancy left in the budget for unexpected fees or expenses.
